## City Sees Double-Digit Increase in April Tax Collections Strong April Also Drives Increase in Year-to-Date Collections

The City collected approximately \$642.2 million in General Fund tax revenue in April 2019, compared to \$528.8 million in April 2018, an increase of \$113.4 million, or 21.5 percent according to preliminary figures. Notably, business income and receipts ("BIRT") tax collection totaled \$356.8 million, \$82.0 million more than in April of last year, for an increase of 29.9 percent. This increase, along with increases in almost all other tax categories resulted in a year-to-date increase in total collections of 7.3 percent—surpassing the City's projection of 2.2 percent by a substantial margin. Double-digit increases for April collections were also seen in the realty transfer, amusement, other miscellaneous, and parking taxes. The only tax categories to decrease in April were the real estate and beverage taxes.

## **MONTH OF APRIL COLLECTIONS**

Aside from the previously mentioned increase in the BIRT tax, the City saw considerable increases in almost all tax categories in April compared to the same month last year, as shown in Table 2. The City experienced double-digit increases in the real estate transfer tax (68.3 percent), the amusement tax (46.4 percent), other miscellaneous taxes (33.4 percent), and the parking tax (14.6 percent). Additionally, the City portion of the total wage, earnings, and net profits taxes increased by 8.1 percent, the second-highest month-over-month increase in this fiscal year, just behind February (8.2 percent).



### **APRIL YEAR-TO-DATE COLLECTIONS**

The City collected \$3.148 billion in tax revenue through April of FY2019, an increase of \$212.9 million, or 7.3 percent over the same period last year. Year-to-date increases were realized in every tax category except the real estate transfer and beverage taxes. Considerable increases were seen in the the BIRT (24.5 percent), and amusement (25.2 percent) taxes, while other miscellaneous (8.7 percent), real estate (7.8 percent), total wage, earnings, and net profits taxes (4.6 percent); and City sales taxes (1.1 percent) also increased. In terms of FY2019 projections, only the City sales tax failed to meet or exceed the City's expected figure, with some taxes exceeding projections. It is expected that the City will adjust some or all of its projections in its forthcoming Quarterly City Managers Report, due later this month.

The City's current FY2019 revenue estimates are found in the City's *Quarterly City Managers Report for the Period Ending December 31, 2018*, which was issued on February 15, 2019. The current projection for FY2019 General Fund tax revenue is \$3.462 billion, an increase of 0.5 percent over the City's Five Year Plan projection. Combined City and PICA tax revenue is projected at \$3.938 billion, an increase of 0.6 percent over the Plan projection.
